→ Prioritization Process:

The coalition was separated into three breakout groups to discuss priority areas for the 2016-2020 Monmouth County CHIP. Below are the lists of priority areas each individual group produced:

Group 1

- Health disparities
- Behavioral Health (suicide, mental health, substance abuse)
- Access to care

Group 2

- Mental Health
 - Substance abuse
 - Suicide
 - Access to care
 - Post sandy stress
 - Health education and promotion
- Health Equity
 - Health literacy
 - Cultural diversity
 - Demographic disparities
 - Access to care
 - Health education and promotion
- Healthy Lifestyle
 - Obesity
 - Diabetes
 - Cancer
 - Cardiovascular disease
 - STDs
 - Health education and promotion
 - Nutrition
 - Physical activity

Group 3

- Mental health
- Birth outcomes
- Immunizations
- Diabetes
- Tobacco/smoking
- Obesity/nutrition

→ The group reconvened to participate in a prioritization voting process. The three group lists were consolidated to account for duplicate priority areas. Each individual was given three colored stickers: one worth two points, indicating their first vote, and two additional stickers worth one point each, indicating their second and third votes. The voting process resulted in the following distribution of points:

- Mental Health- 27 points
- Health Equity- 24 points
- Healthy Lifestyle- 19 points
- Birth Outcomes- 6 points
- Access to Care- 5 points
- Immunizations- 3 points

→ Following a group discussion, three priority areas were chosen for the 2016-2020 Monmouth County CHIP:
